Fire Officer I Course Descriptions

Fire Prevention Practices FFP 0505

A study of fire inspection practices, activities, hazards, fire causes, types of construction, flame spread, occupancy and fire load, inspection techniques, and conducting inspections.

Text: Fire Inspection and Code Enforcement, 6th ed.

Private Fire Protection Systems I FFP 0540

Sprinkler and standpipe systems, chemical extinguishing systems, and detection systems and devices. Each system is discussed as to its need, construction, preventive maintenance and individual uses.

Text: Fire Protection Handbook I & II (also used for Building Construction...)

Building Construction for the Fire Service FFP 0120

Topics for this course include identifying hazards from assault by fire and gravity, how building construction can influence fire spread, fire confinement, structural collapse, and other life safety issues.

Text: Fire Protection Handbook I & II (Also used for Private Fire Protection Systems I & II)

Company Officer FFP 0720

Designed to assist company officers in solving the varied problems and situations they will be required to manage effectively in today's ever-changing fire service. The course includes a review of fire department organization and administration, management theory, leadership, communication, motivation, and small group dynamics.

Fire Service Course Delivery FFP 0740

The curriculum draws from leading educational authorities on the principles of adult learning, methods and mechanics of imparting information, and ways of measuring teaching effectiveness and maximizing the use of media and visual aids.

Text: Active Training, 2nd ed.

Firefighting Tactics and Strategy I and II FFP 0810/0821

The **first course** covers basic factors involved in coping with an emergency scene and determining the best use of available resources in protecting lives and property. Emphasis is given to the changing nature of an emergency situation and the ways in which the fire officer can evaluate the effectiveness of his or her proposed Incident Action Plan.

The **second course** covers multiple company operations, logistics, strategy, and use of mutual aid forces and conflagration control. It is intended for officers who may be in command of fires and other emergencies involving close cooperation and maximum use of large amounts of manpower and equipment.

Text: Fireground Strategies

Incident Management System: Basic and Intermediate

This 32-hour course covers the principles and features of an incident command system, how an incident command system is organized, incident facilities and their purposes, incident resources and common responsibilities.

Text: Basic ICS: I-200 & I-300

Emergency Response to Terrorism: Basic

This 16-hour awareness level course, developed by the National Fire Academy, is designed primarily for fire-rescue and EMS personnel, although other emergency responders can benefit from the course.

The program covers the history and categories of terrorism and terrorist organizations in the United States and abroad, self-protection measures to be taken at explosive and NBC (nuclear-biological-chemical) incidents, crime scene and

perimeter control procedures, defensive tactical operations, and building an incident Command organization for terrorism responses.

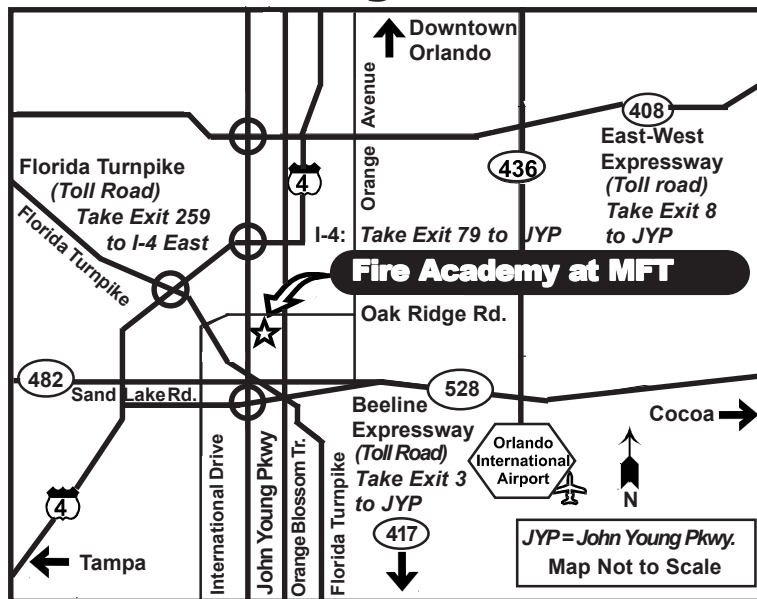

Travel Directions

- **From the Florida Turnpike**, take Exit 259 and head **east** on I-4.
- **From I-4** take Exit 79 and head **south** on John Young Pkwy to Oak Ridge Rd.
- **From the East-West Expressway** (408/toll) take Exit 8. Head **south** on John Young Pkwy.
- **From the Beeline Expressway** (528/toll) take Exit 3 and head **north** on John Young Pkwy.
- **If traveling south on John Young Pkwy**, turn **left** at Oak Ridge Rd. Make a **right** turn at Chancellor Dr. and proceed to the last MFT entrance. (See map below.)
- **If traveling north on John Young Pkwy**, turn **right** at Oak Ridge Rd. Make a **right** turn at Chancellor Dr. and proceed to the last MFT entrance. (See map below.)

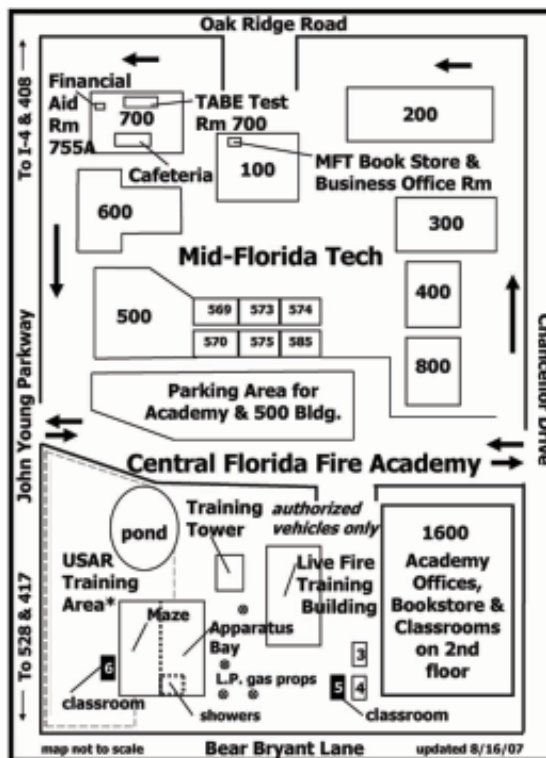
