- ___ 6. Depth and submersible pressure gauges
- ___ 7. BC with oral and power inflator
- ___ 8. Two tanks with current Hydro & VIP
- ___ 9. Mask ___ Snorkel ___ Fins ___ Weight belt
- ___ 10. Two cutting tools (knife, wire or side cutters)
- ___ 11. Pen and paper for notetaking and sketching

- From the Florida Turnpike, take Exit 259 and head **east** on I-4.

- From the East-West Expressway (408/toll) take Exit 8. Head **south** on John Young Pkwy.
- From the Beeline Expressway (528/toll) take Exit 3 and head **north** on John Young Pkwy.

Parking Directions

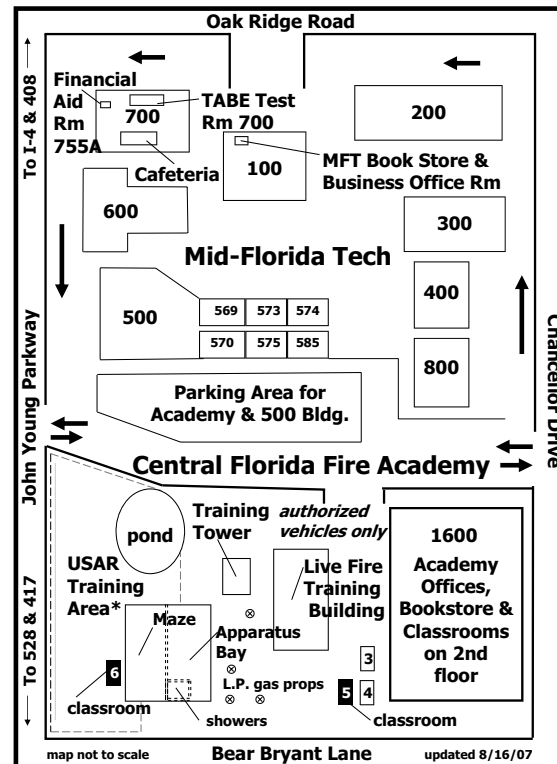
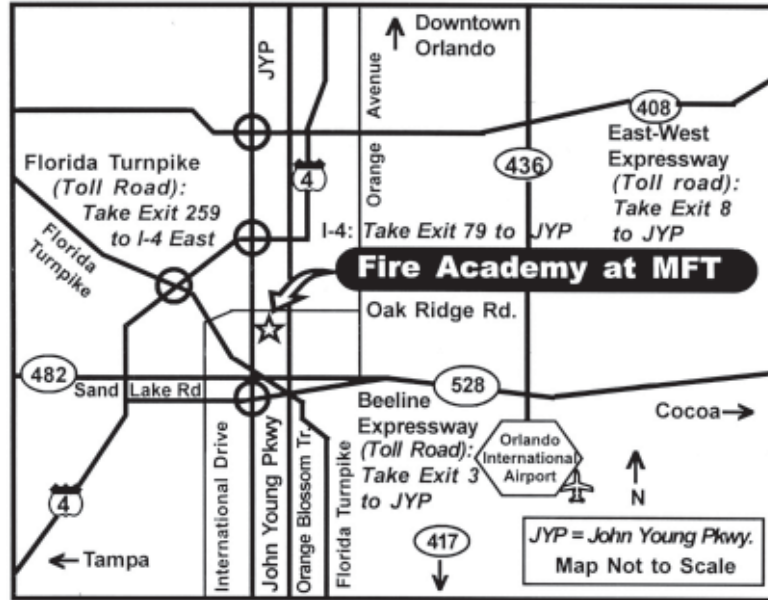
