Vehicle and Machinery Rescue (VMR): Operational is a 40-hour hands on class with 10% classroom and 90% field work. The subjects covered will include the anatomy of a passenger vehicle, scene control, safety, special hazards, patient care, controlling hazards and tool lab.

Students perform extensive extrication with hand tools, stabilization equipment and hydraulic tools. The course is designed to strictly meet NFPA 1670 and NFPA 1006. Upon completion of VMR: Operational the student will be eligible to enroll in VMR: Technician.

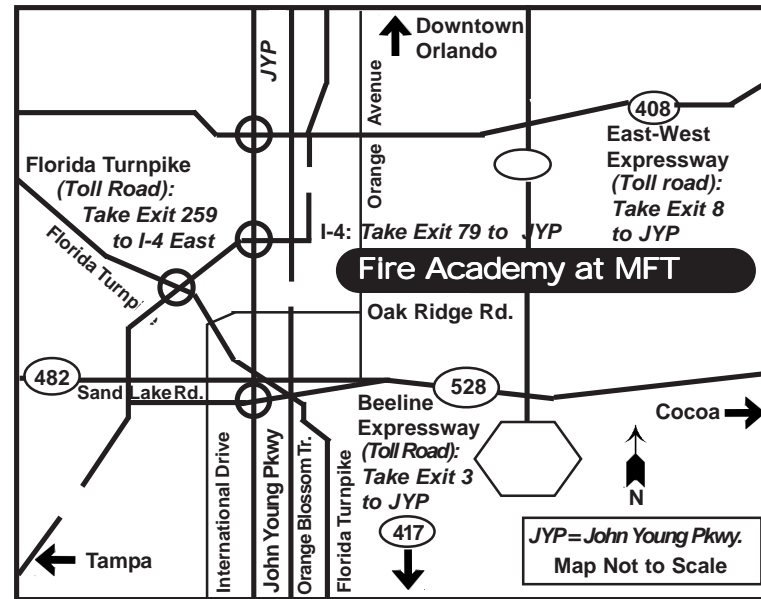

- **From the Florida Turnpike**, take Exit 259 and head **east** on I-4.
- **From I-4** take Exit 79 and head **south** on John Young Pkwy to Oak Ridge Road.
- **From the East-West Expressway** (408/toll) take Exit 8. Head **south** on John Young Pkwy.
- **From the Beeline Expressway** (528/toll) take Exit 3 and head **north** on John Young Pkwy.

Parking Directions

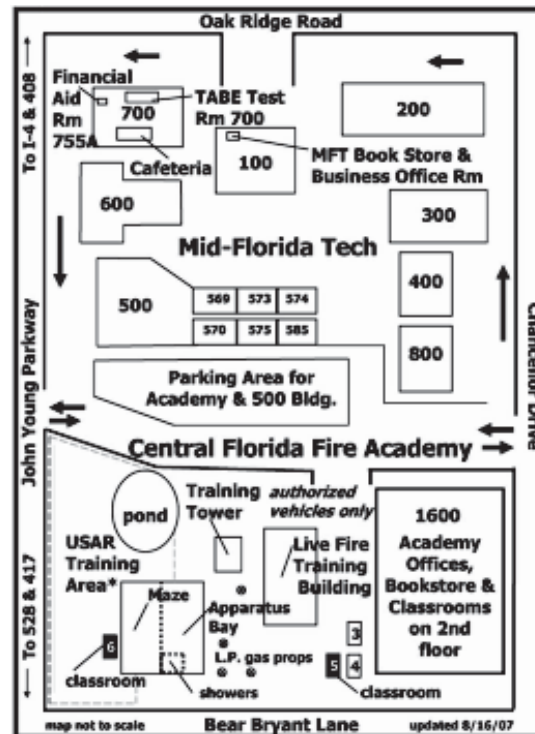
